History of Bedias Women's Club

In the early fifties, a group of ladies formed the Bedias What-Not-Club. The club met each month in different homes. They participated in many worth-while activities of the community. It is said that they first kept their money in a fruit jar.

In 1976, the club made and entered a float in the Navasota Centennial Parade and the Sidewalk Cattlemen's Parade in Madisonville. They won prizes in both of those entries! The theme featured early pioneers. It is said that Mildred Smith, a charter member, demonstrated her ability to fire a shotgun.

During the early fifties, the club started playing the Exchange-A-Christmas-Gift game at their annual Christmas Party. This game is played and enjoyed by the club members to this day.

In 1979, the What-Not-Club changed their name to the ladies Auxiliary of the Bedias Civic Club. They assisted the Civic Club in all their activities. On June 25, 1981, the club changed their name to the Bedias Women's Club. Through the years, the club has contributed enthusiastically to the Bedias Community.
